She was born in Hyde Park, Utah on April 3, 1915 and celebrated her 100th birthday at her son's (Michael Schaub) home in Redding, California, surrounded by 21 family members. Mae was an accomplished artist, seamstress, knitter and quilter and was not to be outdone in her kitchen. She was a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and the Relief Society Organization. She enjoyed her family's rich pioneer heritage and participated in the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers. Mae married Howard Adams Schaub (1913-1995) on March 13, 1938 in Logan, Utah and was later sealed for time and all eternity in the LDS Seattle Temple on May 25, 1991. Howard preceded her in death as did her two younger brothers, Dennis and Donald. She is survived by her daughter, Linda Mae Beagles (husband, Bill) of Phoenix, Arizona; and her son, Michael Howard Schaub (wife, Elizabeth Bartschi Schaub) of Redding, California.
