It is with a broken heart, that I have to announce my Father's passing. He joined Jesus and my Mamma this past Saturday, November 14th. All the pain and suffering he has had to endure for the past three years is finally over. My Pappa was a kind, loving and soft-spoken man. He loved my Mother and I dearly. Even though my Mom has been gone for over 20 years, he never took his wedding ring off and even had her toothbrush still next to his. She was the love of his life. He taught me right from wrong and was always there when I needed him. He was the best Dad a girl could ever ask for.

As all those who knew my Dad, his passion was Ham Radios and his little man (Perseus his fur baby who was by his side till the very end.). His call sign was W6PZE (silent key), which he had for over 70 years. He mentored many, worked on head-ends and stations and was a member of the Golden Bear Net for nearly 50 years. He was an Army PFC in the Radio Battalion during the Korean War, as well as the Naval Reserves. Radios were in his blood.

Though I know he is looking down on me, the Pappa and Daughter team of the past 20 years is now over. There were times where it felt like it was us against the world. But his faith in me never waivered. Dad's Mom, Mattie Hansen (Mickelson) passed in 1980 and his Dad, Iver Hansen in 1949. He was an only child and I his only daughter. He is survived by many First, Second and Third cousins on both the Hansen and Mickelson sides. He grew up and called Petaluma California home. And retired with my mother to New Zealand after over 27 years as a Cable TV Technician. He asked to be

cremated and be put next to Mamma here at home, so “they could both watch over me” and to have his memorial service here on the farm.
