He leaves behind his brother, Jim of Concord, CA --"That's me"-- and his precious cowgirl, his daughter, Lora of Corning, CA, along with the prettiest chocolate Lab you'll ever see, Duke, and his faithful Buckskin horse, DK.

Born in Rosedale, Oklahoma in 1940 to Ismael Louis Hill and Lillie Mae, Virgil came to Benecia, California with his parents when he was just two, part of that big ol' Dust Bowl exodus. He graduated from Mt. Diablo High School in Concord, CA, in 1959 and went on to build a life filled with hard work, adventure, and a whole lot of horsepower - Ask Virgil and he will tell you "I'm pure okie!".

From 1961 to 1962, he worked as an automobile mechanic at Howard Eddy Ford in Concord. He also spent a year with Matheson Trucking. During the Vietnam war he spent six months loading ammunition in port Chicago. In 1978, he worked as an auto mechanic at Lincoln Mercury and Jefferson Motors before eventually retiring from the buisness of The City Of Concord in 2009.

Virgil had a passion for life, which extended to his hobbies. He loved watching

Gunsmoke and tearing up the trails 4-wheeling on the Rubicon. He was an avid outdoorsman who found joy in duck and goose hunting with his shotguns, spending countless hours in the blind soaking in the peace of the wild.

Through it all, he lived life on his own terms, always with a story to tell and a laugh to share.

Virgil excelled in the art of living life to the fullest. It has been a good life. He rode hard, laughed loudly, and loved fiercely. He spread that love far and wide, leaving a mark on everyone lucky enough to cross his path, ask him for the shirt off his back and you've got it.
